The meeting of the St. Louis Labor Council was called to order by President Robert Soutier at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, February 19, 2013.

President Soutier led the delegates in the invocation, followed by the pledge of allegiance to our country's flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

President Soutier asked for a moment of silence for Mike Webb retired member of Heat & Frost Insulators, Local #1 and for Cary Hammond, Labor Attorney with Hammond & Shinnors, P.C.

SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

Tony Rippetto, Bus Rep with Machinists' District No. 9 stood at the microphone and made a motion to posthumously make Cary Hammond, an honorary Delegate to the St. Louis Labor Council. Tony said that Cary was a friend to many in Labor and was such a strong union advocate and intelligent lawyer that he would be very proud to be made a delegate. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

President Soutier called Sonja Gholston-Byrd, CLUW, John Bachinski, Operating Engineers, Local #513, Randy Holmes, Musicians, Local #2, Mark Esters, Local #6355 and Sandra Henderson, Robert Fritz, Kurt Manns, Steve Newell, and Clem Smith with Aerospace Lodge 837A to the podium and gave them the oath of office to represent their local unions as delegates to the St. Louis Labor Council.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the January 15, 2013 meeting minutes. Copies of the minutes were available at the entrance of the room.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As a special order of business, Vice President John Ebeling read the following Resolution in support of Unite Here, Local #74

Support of the Global Hyatt Boycott

WHEREAS, the Hyatt Hotel Corporation has taken advantage of the dire economic conditions facing the country by proposing major cuts in established health insurance benefits for its unionized workers in Chicago, San Francisco and Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, Hyatt has refused the request by workers in several cities including Indianapolis, San Antonio, Santa Clara, Scottsdale, San Francisco and Long Beach for a fair process to select a union. The Grand Hyatt San Antonio recently settled a NLRB complaint which alleged that workers had been intimidated and retaliated against for participating in legally protected union activities; and

WHEREAS, the Hyatt in Boston fired approximately 100 long time employees in three Boston area hotels and replaced them with subcontracted workers at minimum wage and no health insurance. The subcontracted workers now clean as many as 30 rooms a day, nearly double what is typically required of union workers. Many of the fired employees report that Hyatt required that they train their replacements; and

WHEREAS, a study published in the American Journal of Industrial Medicine examining hotel worker injuries from 50 U.S. hotels demonstrated that housekeepers at Hyatt hotels were more likely to be injured on the job than housekeepers at hotels of other major companies. The study also found that Hispanic housekeepers had the highest rate of all housekeepers, making them almost twice as likely to be injured as white housekeepers in the study; and

WHEREAS, In one especially egregious example of disrespect for its workers, on July 21, 2011, heat lamps in the awning above the Park Hyatt Chicago front entrance were turned on striking workers the morning a strike began and turned off shortly after reports about them surfaced in the press. That day, an excessive heat warning was issued by the National Weather Service, with heat index readings climbing above 100 degrees in downtown Chicago; and

WHEREAS, In response, Hyatt workers have taken bold steps to end mistreatment, speaking publicly about abuses, going on strike, and even launching a global boycott of Hyatt; and

WHEREAS, the national AFL-CIO along with a broad number of national organizations has endorsed the Global Boycott of Hyatt Hotels.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Missouri AFL-CIO reaffirms the Global Boycott called against Hyatt Hotels. We will not eat, meet, or sleep in boycotted Hyatt Hotels; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Missouri AFL-CIO will make affiliates, community allies and union members aware of the boycott and will ask them to make the pledge; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Missouri AFL-CIO will picket, march, and mobilize in various ways to support workers wanting to form a union without employer intimidation and for a fair and just contract.

The meeting of the St. Louis Labor Council, AFL-CIO Executive Board was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by President Robert Soutier on Thursday, February 14, 2013.

President Soutier called the meeting to order and asked that everyone introduce themselves since there were a few new people in attendance.

President Soutier then asked Kate Souders to leave the room for a short period of time while the Board discussed a bonus. It had previously been discussed with the Compensation Committee and it was decided that since she always performs her job at a high level and had performed her job above and beyond during Karen's absence due to her health, that Kate should be awarded a \$1000 bonus. A motion was made, seconded and approved to agree to the bonus.

Randy Kiser and Luke Canfora with the MO AFL-CIO then spoke about the plan to have union members contact their state senators to let them know they are against Right to Work coming to Missouri by sending letters, emails and RoBo calls.

Luke came to us from Michigan and spoke about how quickly Right to Work took over that state and explained what we must do to keep it from happening in Missouri. One of the most important things is to educate people as to what Right to Work really is.

Randy Kiser asked for each union to avail themselves of at least one to three people who could be available for training sessions they will be holding in the near future.

Randy said that they are concentrating first on the following State Senate Districts:

Randy has sample letters and sample scripts for RoBo calls available to the members. He mentioned that we must be forceful, but not confrontational in our delivery of this message. Roz then gave a re-cap of the 2012 \$5 for the Fight Fund.

President Soutier spoke about the Robert O. Kortkamp Memorial Union Labor Mass to be held on Sunday, May 5, 2013 at the Shrine of St. Joseph, beginning at 8:30 a.m. with a tribute outside the church to those union members who have passed away in the past year on the job or due to a work related illness or injury. The mass will then be celebrated at 9:00 a.m. by Father Creason, pastor at Holy Trinity Catholic Church. There will be a brunch following the mass at Maggie O'Brien's. Tickets to the brunch will be \$25 each or \$250 for a table of ten. Proceeds from the brunch go to the Shrine of St. Joseph for its continued restoration effort.

Soutier also reminded everyone of the "Blues Union Nights" where a portion of the ticket price goes to the \$5 for the Fight Fund. Union night dates are Tuesday, 2/19/13; Friday, 3/1/13; Thursday, 3/14/13; Friday, 4/19/13; and Tuesday, 4/23/13.

Kevin McNatt, President Unite Here, Local #74 explained that he has the backing of the National AFL-CIO and Missouri AFL-CIO in boycotting Hyatt Properties and is now asking for our support. The Resolution states:

Jen Stuhlman representing Mark Woolbright, IAFF 2nd District Vice President, introduced Demetrius Alfred the new President of Fire Fighters, Local #73 in the city of St. Louis.

Demetrius spoke out regarding a form that new city employees are being asked to sign. The form basically states that any and all new individuals who begin working for the City of St. Louis must sign the "Benefits Acknowledgement Form" prior to physically starting work with the City and that completion of the form constitutes a "condition of employment" for all new hires.

President Soutier said that he would contact the Mayor immediately following the meeting to try to get an answer to the reasoning behind this form.
