UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Tom George, President IBEW, Local #1 recommended that the delegates reconsider the vote that the Fire District purposed at the December delegate meeting, stating that he did not feel comfortable taking the power away from the Labor Clubs.

The vote as stated in the December minutes was as follows:

"President Soutier announced that there was a recommendation from the Board regarding a change with the Labor Clubs and Fire and Ambulance districts. They asked that in Fire Districts and Ambulance Districts, labor clubs will endorse only candidates supplied to them by the IAFF. In return for this, the IAFF will only propose candidates that will commit to build with AFL-CIO contractors and will promote union principals in the workplace.

Should the IAFF not propose a candidate, then the labor club is free to endorse any candidate they choose.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept this change."
